

## Girls Pack Checkers for Soldiers.

The "Red Triangle Volunteers," young women employed in the headquarters of the National War Work Council of the Young Women's Christian Association, at 124 East Twenty-eighth Street, will spend today at their homes filling tobacco bags with checkers for soldiers in cantonments in this country and in France. The matter of getting 300,000 checkers loaded into bags of thirty each was a problem until the girls volunteered. About 10,000 soldiers will get a checker board and fifteen blue and fifteen white checks. After the checkers have been bagged and returned to headquarters they will be sent to the soldiers.
